

0.0 PRE-REQUISITES & ELECTIVES:



TOTAL CREDITS: 120 total credits are required for graduation. The number of electives and prerequisites you need varies according to your program of study.

0.0 Upper Division = (300 & 400 level courses) 42 upper division credits required for graduation, 30 of which must be in residence at CSU or (with prior approval) in a program under CSU jurisdiction. Upper division credits within vary widely depending on choices of Track courses. If going abroad in your graduating semester no more than 15 credits can be taken abroad.
